Building and home update

Now that we are becoming more settled and familiar in the home and as we become closer to full occupancy could we please ask everyone to observe the following:

- We welcome all visitors but if we could please ask that small children and pets are supervised when visiting.
- When entering and leaving the building please do not let others in unless there is a member of staff to greet them and sign them in. Also please do not let others out of the building.
- Please could you be patient when visiting or telephoning out of hours, i.e. before 8am or after 5pm Monday to Fridays and weekends. When visiting out of hours there is also a large grey button next to the entry call system at the front entrance. This is part of our call aid system and if you press this out of hours the bell will sound throughout the building and a member of staff will arrive to let you in.
