Notes from the Chairman

Driving to the Home on one of my recent visits I found myself wondering why it was that I was feeling the same sensations as I had felt years ago when my wife and I were expecting the arrival of our first baby. The feelings of excitement at the prospect of an addition to the family mixed with the anxieties which naturally accompany the condition - are we following all the advice we are being given, are all our preparations enough and ready for the big day etc. etc.

And so, it has been with the development of the Home - except that a pregnancy normally lasts for nine months and this has been going on for eleven years. Along the way we have had times of great satisfaction seeing plans coming together only to be faced with the disappointments and anxieties of delays, planning difficulties, a world-wide pandemic and escalating costs.



And then the day arrives and the wait is over. The arrival of the baby is a uniquely joyful moment and all the worries experienced along the way are forgotten - for a while. But then comes the moment when the baby and the mother come home and reality stares you in the face. How do we cope with the responsibility of caring for this tiny human being? But we do cope one way and another and look back on the event as one of great satisfaction.

At the end of a lengthy and very warm meeting with development managers, contractors and consultants on Monday 12th August it was agreed that The Royal Cambridge Home at 84 Hurst Road was ready to be delivered to us - and so it was. It was that same moment when we realised that we now had the responsibility for looking after it. And that is where the similarities with the arrival of a baby disappear

"It" is a building however and what goes on within the building and its grounds are the important things and in that respect we know that our residents are in the care of our wonderful staff. For many years we have been delivering residential care in buildings which were never designed for that purpose and the awkward layout with multiple staircases and narrow corridors made the work of the staff more difficult. We believe that the new building will prove to be a much easier and more pleasant environment in which to continue to give care and support for our residents.

Many of the staff who have been with us for a long time have said how they have great affection for the old buildings and will be sorry to witness the demolition of No. 82 taking place in the course of the next few days. It marks the end of one era and the start of a new chapter in the life of The Royal Cambridge Home in premises fit for delivery of the service of which we are justifiably proud.
